All parents/guardians are responsible to review and adhere to the important 2021-22 information including policies, protocols and guidance. *Please know that the contents and outlines of these protocols followed at St. Rose St. Mary's School may be adjusted to keep with the ever changing needs due to the pandemic.*

Face Coverings / Masks

St. Rose St. Mary's School will recommend, but not require, all students and staff to wear masks in our school building and at church.

- This may change at any time with Federal, State, Diocesan, or Local Mandates. The Administration Team also has the authority to require face masks if/as needed based on the needs of our school family.
- The Green Bay Diocese requires masks if a school has over 10% of the school community with a positive COVID 19 test. Masks will continue to be required until the school achieves an infection rate of less than 5%.
- Students and staff with underlying health conditions or concerns should consider wearing a mask for preventative purposes.

Learning Platforms

- 100% In Person - 5 days a week
- If a student is quarantined, materials and assignments will be given to work on at home independently with teacher contact.
- A live full time virtual option, WILL NOT be provided.
- If a student is quarantined, a limited virtual real time option may be available.

Communication

- To the best of our ability, SSRM will effectively communicate with all stakeholders regarding reopening, crisis, and health plans, which might impact them.
- Guardians should communicate with the office when children are not feeling well, or are exposed to COVID-19 and keep children with obvious COVID-19 symptoms or exposure at home. SSRM will work with families to arrange homework pickup.
- Exposed persons' parents/guardians will receive a phone call from the school and could be required to quarantine for a specific amount of time.

Social Distancing

Social distancing will be encouraged by adults and encouraged practiced.

- SSRM staff members will discuss with students the idea of personal space or each person's circle of grace.
- Where possible, classrooms and the lunchroom will be arranged to allow students to socially distance themselves.

Cleaning and Sanitation

- Frequent cleaning of common surfaces and spaces
- Hand sanitizer stations will be provided & increased handwashing will take place.

COVID-19 Symptoms

Students will be asked to stay home if they have one or more symptoms in column A and two or more symptoms from column B.

Symptoms Chart	
1 Symptom / Column A	2 Symptoms / Column B
Fever greater than 100.0 F New Loss of Taste/Smell Cough - New/Uncontrolled Shortness of Breath Difficulty Breathing	Muscle or Body Aches Congestion or Runny Nose Fatigue Sore Throat Chills Headache Diarrhea Vomiting

It is highly recommended that persons with any symptoms wear a mask

Student Absenteeism

- SSRM will work with parents to promote healthy practices in the school and home setting.
- SSRM teachers will prepare accordingly for prolonged student absences. Each SSRM teacher will work with individual students who miss many days of school.
- Mrs. Falk will communicate with families who are dealing with prolonged illnesses and create a plan for connecting.

Scenarios for Quarantine

- Positive Persons in the Household
- All household persons would be required to quarantine unless:
 - Proof of vaccination is provided and remain symptom free
 - Negative test result and no symptoms for 24 hours
- Person with symptoms - no confirmed exposure:
 - May return when person has no symptoms for 24 hours
- Person exposed to a confirmed positive Covid-19:
 - Close contact tracing will be conducted
 - Students with close contact will be quarantined (10 days)
 - Students may return in seven (7) days if they receive a negative test after day 5 of exposure.
 - Persons who provide proof of vaccination and remain symptom free are not required to quarantine.

Other Information

- Classroom materials can be shared.
- Visitors and volunteers may be limited.
- School Music events will return to normal.
- Team sports will be allowed for physical education classes.
- Field trips will occur as normal.
- At this time SSRM will not provide Covid testing for students or staff.
- Students should bring a refillable water bottle to limit water fountain use.

Parents, Please Plan For The Following:

- Having to wear masks
- Having a quarantine plan in place
- Having a child care plan in place
- A discussion with employer in the event you need to stay home with your child

Final Statements

Visitors who have tested positive MUST REFRAIN from entering the schools or attend school events (Athletics, Parent Teacher Conferences, Open House, Field Trips, etc.).

At any time, school, Diocesan, local, state, or federal officials can make changes to this document. If any changes are made, the community will be notified of the changes. This may include, but is not limited to, closing a classroom, school, or building and/or required masking of students and staff.
